



FIG. 257.—Anatomical dissection of the arm shown in the preceding figure done to illustrate the injury to the musculospiral nerve. It shows beginning gangrene of a putrefactive character around a hemorrhage opposite the upper end of the lower fragment of the humerus, which has extended into the musculospiral sheath at this level. Except for this hemorrhage the nerve at this point is uninjured. There is some blackening of the skin in the bend of the elbow, secondary to a putrefactive gangrene at this point.
