The masses have the appearance of the stratified squamous epithelium of mucous membranes. This represents part of the process of organization in a peribronchiolar consolidation following influenza. Proliferative changes of this type are seen in the bronchioles and have extended into the atria and alveoli, or the epithelium of these structures has piled up and differentiated into the stratified squamous type.
