Pieces of filter paper about 5 mm. square, and containing about 0.001 c. c. of 95 per cent dichlorethylsulphide were applied to the center of a square of skin, covered with the protectives. The coatings were as follows: 117, raw linseed oil; 118, linseed oil and kaolin, 1 to 3; 119, same with 3 per cent of soft soap; 120, petrolatum kaolin, 1 to 1; 121, dichloramine-T, 10 per cent in chlorcosane; 122, solid paraffin. The photographs were made 1 day after the application. Note that the reaction is less in 121 than in the others; 26 and 30 are recrudescences of lesions 25 days old. (The figures refer to experiments.)
